Foodbank Manager Review March 2024

Dunfermline

Foodbank figures Apr 2022 to Mar 2023

- We fed 9,204 people of which there were 5,688 Adults and 3,516 Children
 Client use up by 28% on 2021/2022
- 108,980kgs of Food donated up by 20% (7% of which was food we had to purchase ourselves)
- 117,980kgs of Food distributed to people in need up by 11%



The last year (April 2023 – Present)

• Another busy year but with a slight drop in clients which we think is due to the Cost of Living Payments from the Government which dropped into bank accounts in early Spring, July, November 2023 and a further one in February 2024.

• Recruitment of new volunteers has helped keep the foodbanks and warehouse well resourced, however, it has been proving difficult to recruit for the Benarty and Cowdenbeath Foodbanks even though Induction Training has been offered in those areas. We are looking at new ways to recruit in those areas including attending Volunteer Recruitment Days.

• All Foodbanks are stable in their premises with no moves and we have signed a new 5 year lease for our Warehouse.

• Funding Grants have been applied for to enable us to recruit new members of Staff.


Update: - E Referring

 A decision was made in January this year to stop issuing Red Vouchers to Referrers and encourage use of the online system for all vouchers. This will improve the audit trail and we can all see at a glance how many times a client has attended the foodbank.



• Our Foodbanks will still accept Red Vouchers but they will be phased out.

- 2 new Staff Members in post hopefully by Summer/Autumn.
- Be more proactive in the Cash First Approach Pilots running in the Dunfermline and South West Fife Poverty Action Group areas.
